St. Jude Catholic Church Pantry Ministry Volunteers in Action!

Food Pantry Ministry is a year-round task. The Pantry storerooms and shelves must be managed, organized and properly maintained. The Ministry has 10 to 12 volunteers assigned to do various tasks ranging from picking up food, storing food, sorting and counting food items, checking on expiration dates, folding clothes, making sure clothing is clean and in good condition, setting up, handing out, and cleaning up to get ready for the next food day. The Ministry does the work on Tuesdays and Thursdays, 2 days a week, 52 weeks a year (53 weeks in a leap year). They are there to feed those who are hungry and homeless, whoever they are.

Lift up their spirits! Besides food, canned goods, household items, furniture, appliances, clothing, shoes, accessories, toiletries and school supplies, the Pantry Ministry provides items that can't be bought with foods stamps, i.e. gas and gift cards donated by others. Assistance provided: 2/15 - 415 people. 2/14 - 355 people.
